MinistryWatch.com has often been asked to identify the “best ministries” and has been producing reports on what we have termed “Shining Light Ministries”. Given the large numbers of impressive Christian ministries and the many factors to consider to make such a determination (which will vary from person to person), such a task is quite difficult. Responsible giving is through prayer, following the Holy Spirit, and clear thinking in selecting those ministries that the Lord would have them support. Educating yourself by using the comprehensive information found at MinistryWatch.com is a part of the process in becoming a good steward with the resources God has given.

While identifying the best ministries is challenging given the selfless work that so many do for the cause of Christ, MinistryWatch.com believes that the following alphabetical list of 30 excellent ministries will be helpful to many. Each of the ministries mentioned has the following important features in common:

- MinistryWatch.com researchers knows of no significant issues that would be of concern to donors.
- Have shown a willingness to treat donors fairly via a Transparency Grade of “A”.
- Are unashamed of being identified as an evangelical Christian ministry.

A high MinistryWatch.com Financial Efficiency Rating was not a requirement for inclusion on our list although most do have good ratings. Many factors were reviewed and strengths in other areas can offset weakness in financial efficiency when determining whether a ministry should be of interest to donors seeking to be good stewards of their giving.

They also handle death notifications, make hospital visits and perform crisis intervention and many unplanned engagements. About eight out of 10 inmates released from jail or prison will return within the same year, while only one out of 10 who complete the ministry's program will return. They are helping those in true spiritual need.

Fellowship Evangelism

Denny Ryberg, the current president and CEO of YL, states that the scope of YL's mission is no less than to reach "every kid, everywhere, for eternity." YL's plan for implementing this mission is as simple and straightforward today as it was when first articulated by YL founder Jim Rayburn: "We can't wait for teenagers to come to us; we must go to them." YL helps to make the Bible exciting for teenagers. YL field workers are well trained and committed role models. YL has been rapidly growing for several years (in keeping with its goal to reach every teen). YL does not get "pushy" with the Gospel; rather, youngsters are allowed to respond willingly.

Donor Discussion Items

No one is possessed of unlimited resources, and thus we cannot give to every ministry that we value. We are forced to choose to give to some ministries, and not to give to others. We need to make an assessment of our options and make discerning decisions. More time involved on the process and/or reliance on independent sources like MinistryWatch.com will help provide confident, wise giving decisions. Start by getting information before committing your financial resources. Consider the following in your assessment:

Transparency:

How transparent and open to questions is the ministry? Will they seek to hide their failings while trumpeting their successes? Do they provide adequate financial reports for donors to be good stewards of their giving? Do not give to a ministry that claims it has no legal obligation to share financial or other information—it has a moral obligation to do so. In such cases donors do not have a legal obligation to give and do have a moral obligation to give to those ministries that will allow them to be good stewards of their giving.

Truth Claims:

Is the organization telling the truth? If the ministry states that your gifts are tax deductible, is it true? Is the organization in fact what it says it is and is it doing what it claims?

Function/ Sector:

What kind of ministry do you believe the Lord is guiding you to give to? What kind of ministry do you want to give to? Some options include: Relief and Development, Foreign Missions, Fellowship Evangelism, Evangelism Support, Evangelism, Educational Media, Community Development, Christian Growth, Advocacy.

Values/ Worldview:

Ministries represent values, but do they represent your values? How is the organization “Christian?” Is it Christian in name only? Do they just market to Christians? Do they evangelize? What is their message? Do they teach? What do they teach? How do their theological underpinnings determine their actions? Have they strayed from theological beginnings? Are their motivations based on a theological premise? Do they have a statement of faith or a creed? What do they say or not say about God? Is it important that the organization is pro-life? Is it important how they define family? Are denominational connections important?

Financial Efficiency:


How efficient is the ministry in using its resources? MinistryWatch.com has developed a 5 Star Financial Efficiency Ratings to measure a ministry's financial efficiency. This is an objective measure because they are derived from financial ratios that are based on financial information contained within a ministry's audited financial statement or its IRS Form 990. The overall rating is a summarization of the financial efficiency rating system's three efficiency area assessments. The three efficiency areas are Fund Acquisition, Resource Allocation and Asset Utilization.

Program Effectiveness:

What information is available in what the organization has done? What are the fruits of their labor? Is the organization just all talk or are they accomplishing great benefits to society?

Red Flags:

Are there any odd aspects of the ministry? Is the organization embroiled in lawsuits and, if so, why? Does the organization employ highly emotional fundraising appeals? Emotional appeals that question the depth of your faith should generally be ignored. Is the organization's structure reasonably simple? Do the claims made by the ministry seem realistic? Does the ministry seem to manipulate scripture or rely on extra biblical revelations?

(1) Think before your give. **(2)** Get information. **(3)** Align to those ministries that are doing what is important to you. **(4)** Give with confidence and rest with the joy of increased giving.
